



AREC Corner - Fall 2015



It was nice this summer to see many homeowners submitting Architectural Change Applications to improve their homes. We saw new pools installed, additions built and new fences. Additionally, several homeowners executed maintenance projects like new roofs and new windows. Although the Board of Directors does a great job maintaining the common lands, it is the appearance of individual homes that is the real curb appeal to our community. If you didn't get a chance this summer, take a look at your home and see if it needs power washing, painting, new windows or trim, or new roofs. As always, an AREC application is not required if you make repairs and replacements to your home that do not change the original color, material, design, size, etc.

Fall brings the changing color of leaves and their eventual falling to the ground. Unfortunately, year after year, we need to remind homeowners that leaves must be bagged in clear yard waste bags for pickup by the city and by HOA rules, cannot be placed on the curb in front of your home any earlier than Tuesday (the day before trash pickup). Please keep this in mind and please don't place your lawn debris and leaf bags on the curb prior to Tuesday. Most of us, who don't have lawn service during the week, use the weekends for yard work. Please store your bags behind the rear foundation of your home, out of site from the street until Tuesday. The weekends are popular times for friends and family to visit as well as prospective homeowners to tour the neighborhood looking for homes. What they don't want to see are our streets lined with leaf bags or yard debris. It is not the curb appeal appearance we want in Church Point and it is a rules violation. The Association Manager with Select Group has been forced to send out a larger than normal amount of violation letters for yard debris placed on the curb early. Landlords, you have an obligation to ensure your tenants are aware of and comply with the HOA rules. Any action taken by the Board will be against the owner and not the tenant.

Curb appeal affects all homeowners both positive and negative, so please do your part to help us maintain the curb appeal of our community. If you have questions about whether an application is required or not, please contact us at arec.churchpointhoa@gmail.com.





Neighborhood Watch - Fall 2015

We continue to be fortunate that crime reports and crime activity are down in Church Point. Surrounding neighborhoods on Next Door are reporting car break-ins so please remain vigilant and keep your vehicles locked at night. If you have not joined, please consider signing up. Nextdoor (www.nextdoor.com) is a community specific site for the exchange of information, ideas, community events, but most importantly a communication tool to get information out to all homeowners quickly. Next Door is recommended and in use by the Virginia Beach Police. As those of us currently on Next Door have seen – the VBPD sends out alerts and notifications about incidents. Recently, the VBPD sent out an alert about a shoplifting suspect on September 24th. This site allows for the quick dissemination of information to all the adjacent neighborhoods.

A reminder as the holiday shopping season quickly approaches, please keep in mind the following safety tips while out shopping:

- Be aware of your surroundings when parking and walking to stores
- Always park as close to store entrances as possible and in well-illuminated areas.
- If shopping alone at the mall after dark, ask security for an escort to your vehicle.
- Ladies please consider shopping without your large purse. Carry only the cards/cash you intend on using in a small pocket wallet or cell phone carry case.
- Be sure to place purchases in your trunk and out of sight. Keep your vehicles locked.

If you are taking vacation or leaving town to celebrate the holidays, please ensure you use timers on security lighting, stop your mail / newspaper, and have neighbors collect packages so your home does not look vacant. In closing, if you see suspicious activity, call the VBPD non-emergency # 385-5000.
