Neighbors,

Many of you will be glad to see summer and all the rains that came with it come to an end, especially in the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew. Although the community lost several trees and dealt with the debris cleanup, the reported damage to homes was minimal with the exception of recurring flooding in the Mews. In addition to the noted trees, common area damage consisted of a blown down street sign (reinstalled with assistance from Jack Palmer from the Board) and damage to the lights on the bridge from flood waters cresting at the top of the rails.

Fall is also time for our annual meeting scheduled to be held on Wednesday, November 16th at 6:30PM at the Bayside Recreation Center (check in starting at 6:00). As always, homeowners are encouraged to attend, meet their neighbors and share ideas and feedback with your Board of Directors. Please note, the original mailing by Select Group on the annual meeting had incorrect dates. The confirmed date is Wednesday, November 16th and proxies are due the week prior.

The new landscaping beds at the main entrance and the Mews entrance are now complete and a special thank you goes out to the Garden Club for working with our new landscape company, BrightView, to freshen up the look of both entrances. Several sections of dead red tip shrubs were removed east of the main entrance and will be replaced shortly with hollies to maintain the similar look found along First Court Road. The gazebo suffered several incidents of vandalism this summer, with the rails being repeatedly kicked down and broken. It is unsure if the vandals were youths or strangers stopping by playing Pokémon Go (the gazebo was identified as a public gym). A request was sent to Pokémon Go software developers to remove the gazebo as a gym since it is private HOA property and not open for general public usage.

Additionally, several members of the Board of Directors along with help from neighbor Mike Guglielmo, had to make a second trip into the woods behind the gazebo field and remove a tent and other items that youths were using as a hang out in the woods. Thank you to Mike for lending a much-appreciated helping hand.

I hope everyone enjoys the upcoming holidays and I look forward to seeing many of you at the annual meeting in November.


















Neighborhood Watch – Fall 2016 By Kim Burke and Betsy Guglielmo

We want to ensure that everyone is aware of, and reiterate what has been posted on NEXTDOOR about the CAC (Citizens Advisory Committee). This is a public meeting held at Williams Farm Recreation Center and coordinated through the 3rd Precinct. This is a great opportunity for citizens to communicate directly with the 3rd precinct police captain (Captain Orr), patrol officers and Virginia Beach civic leaders. The CAC is held on the third Thursday of each month at 7pm. At the last meeting, it was emphasized the greatest crime threat to the 3rd precinct remains vehicle break-ins (most of which are left unlocked).

As an annual reminder, with the holiday shopping season quickly approaching, please keep in mind the following safety tips while out shopping:

- Be aware of your surroundings when parking and walking to stores
- Always park as close to store entrances as possible and in well-illuminated areas.
- If shopping alone at the mall after dark, ask security for an escort to your vehicle.
- Ladies please consider shopping without your large purse. Carry only the cards/cash you intend on using in a small pocket wallet or cell phone carry case.
- Be sure to place purchases in your trunk and out of sight, and keep your vehicles locked.

Additionally, if you are taking vacation or leaving town to celebrate the holidays, please ensure you use timers on security lighting, stop your mail / newspaper, and have neighbors collect packages so your home does not look vacant. As always, if you see suspicious activity, call the VBPD non-emergency # 385-5000. 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AREC Corner - Fall 2016

I hope everyone fared well with Hurricane Matthew with little damage suffered to your homes. Of course, any repairs needed from the storm don't require an AREC application as long as restoring to original condition. Fall is the perfect time for new plantings, and of course seeding your lawns. It is also a great time to think about pressure washing homes and fences. As always, our focus is to ensure the continued exterior appearance of our community or "curb appeal." Fall brings the changing color of leaves and their eventual falling to the ground. As a reminder, leaves must be bagged in clear yard waste bags for pickup by the city, and by HOA rules, cannot be placed on the curb in front of your home any earlier than Tuesday afternoon (the day before trash pickup). Please keep this in mind and please don't place your lawn debris and leaf bags on the curb prior to Tuesday. Most of us who don't have lawn service during the week use the weekends for yard work. As a reminder, quiet hours begin at 6PM on Saturday, so please no lawn mowers, chain saws, weed whackers, etc. on Sundays. We continue to get complaints from neighbors and have to issue violation letters. Please store your lawn debris and leaf bags behind the rear foundation of your home out of site from the street until Tuesday.

Curb appeal affects all homeowners, both positive and negative, so please do your part to help us maintain the curb appeal of our community. If you have questions about whether an application is required or not, please don't hesitate to contact us at arec.churchpointhoa@gmail.com.
