The Board will be focusing on maintaining our common land and community curb appeal this spring and we encourage homeowners to focus on their homes and yards this spring also. The Board has contracted to begin replacing the diseased trees along Church Point Road this spring (the trees between the sidewalk and the street that most owners would recognize with the extensive mistletoe growing during the winter). The trees will be removed (including the stump) and new trees planted in new adjacent locations. Although the HOA project only targets the trees on the public easement, any homeowner with an identical tree on the opposite side of Church Point Road that is interested in having their trees removed also, please contact the property manager for info on the contractor to take advantage of the volume pricing the HOA has received.

The Board has contracted to power wash the main entrance brickwork to remove stains and is reviewing options for a similar brick sign at the Mews entrance. Additionally, the Board will be reviewing options to maintain the multiple asphalt paths throughout the neighborhood along with the waterfront area for the safe use of all homeowners. I would like to recognize and say thank you to the Garden Club for volunteering their time to clean up the banks of the lake of trash and debris recently in support of beautifying our community.

In closing, please enjoy the warmer weather, enjoy our common areas and as always be cautious while driving with more kids, bikes, joggers, etc. on the roads.

We hope everyone is enjoying the warm weather. We have several reports of speeding and reckless driving in the neighborhood recently. Please be especially cautious as more homeowners and kids are out playing and riding bikes. Although our neighborhood crime rate has come down, other neighborhoods haven't been as lucky. We were reminded at our last precinct meeting that approximately 60% of burglaries take place during the day. Below are a few suggestions.

- 1. Lock all doors including side garage and sliding glass doors.
- 2. Set your alarm when leaving your home.
- Keep overgrown shrubs and hedges trimmed below windows.
- 4. If you are going out-of-town, have a neighbor check your porch daily for any deliveries.

# AREC Corner – "Spring Projects and Curb Appeal"

As Spring approaches and Homeowners begin their annual Spring projects, AREC wants to remind all homeowners (and please notify your tenants) that an Architectural Change Application (available on our association website) is required anytime you make a change to the exterior of your property. An application is required whether you are adding a pool or a room addition, changing the size of your deck or patio or even changing the color of the outside of your home. If you are repairing something and the end result is either the same product or looks exactly like the original then no application is needed.

Additionally, as the Board of Directors is responsible for maintaining the curb appeal of our community through maintaining the common lands, homeowners are responsible for doing their part in maintaining the curb appeal of the community by maintaining their homes and yards. Both AREC and the Property Manager will be focusing in 2012 on ensuring homeowners are maintaining their yards, home exteriors, driveways and fences. Curb appeal is critical to the appearance of our neighborhood and directly impacts resale value of homes. Please do your part to keep your lawns cut and landscaped beds free of weeds and debris. Take a look at your homes to see if they need updated exterior painting or cleaned up to look fresh. Your cedar fences should also be cleaned if they are turning green and your metal fences should be free of rust and corrosion. Finally, please remember that yard waste and trashcans cannot be placed at the curb earlier than 3PM on Tuesday afternoon and need to be removed from the curb by Wednesday at midnight. Noise restrictions are in effect for Sundays (no grass cutting/chainsaws/etc.), and both trashcans/recycle cans must be stored so they are not visible from the street. Thank you for doing your part to help maintain and enhance the appearance of our neighborhood.
