President's Corner - Spring 2016

Neighbors,

I'm sure you are as happy as I am that the cold weather appears behind us and spring is finally here. As mentioned in previous newsletters and at the annual meeting, the Board went to bid on our landscape contract after numerous ongoing challenges we faced with the previous vendor. After narrowing down the multiple bidders to two, and following individual interviews, the Board awarded the landscape contract to Valley Crest. As many of you may have heard, Valley Crest merged last year with Brickman to form a vast national presence and will be re-branded shortly as BrightView. Valley Crest took over the contract in early March and has already made great strides in cleaning up the landscaping from winter, especially the hollies/crepe myrtles along First Court Road and installing the spring mulch throughout the neighborhood. Spring is the perfect time for all homeowners to take a look at your yards, home exteriors, driveways and fences. Although most homeowners do a fantastic job maintaining their yards and homes, there are several properties that need lawn and landscape attention, pressure washing of fences and driveways, and could use some exterior painting.

The Board recently began preparing the lake for warmer weather, having maintenance performed on the lake pump, to include replacing the seals/gaskets, as well as initiating a pro-active stance against disease carrying mosquitoes. Upon consultation and recommendations from Solitude, the lake management company, the Board approved stocking the lake with minnows. Minnows have a great appetite for mosquito larvae, and will help to eliminate the lake as a source of mosquito breeding. We encourage homeowners to regularly check around their homes for areas of standing water, which will also help to eliminate potential mosquito breeding areas.

Finally, the Board recently approved repairs to the wooden rails along First Court Road that were damaged from a vehicle collision that occurred after it took out a light pole. The association could not file for repairs against the vehicle owner's insurance due to being unable to identify the owner and the exact date the accident took place. If homeowners see similar events in the future that damage Church Point property, please notify The Select Group or a Board member right away with details, dates, descriptions and/or photos. It's always better to make repairs with money from the person causing the damage.

Welcome Spring! We hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather, and are happy to state that we have been extremely fortunate this past winter in Church Point with almost no reports of crime. We still need to be vigilant and aware that crime rates tend to increase with the warmer weather, and when homeowners start planning summer travel trips. When going on vacation for an extended period of time, please consider putting a temporary stop on mail and newspaper deliveries, as that can be indicators to thieves of empty homes. Our number one reported crime issue continues to be vehicle larcenies. Most times, the vehicle doors were unfortunately unlocked. We cannot stress enough the importance of keeping your vehicles locked at all times and not leaving any items of value inside. Additionally, with warmer weather there are more bikers, joggers, walkers and especially children outside and on the streets and sidewalks. Please be alert and watch your speed while driving through the neighborhood. The posted speed limit is 25 MPH and is being enforced by VBPD to ensure everyone's safety.

The City of Virginia Beach has a nightly curfew from 11 p.m. - 5 a.m. for anyone under the age of 18. In the past, the warmer weather has generated increased reports of teenagers out roaming the streets, and hanging out at the gazebo or the bridge leading to the shopping center well after midnight.

Thank you to everyone who has joined Nextdoor. If you haven't yet signed up, please consider doing so. There are currently more than 200 homeowners from Church Point enrolled. Nextdoor (www.nextdoor.com) is a community specific site for the exchange of information, ideas, and community events, but most importantly a communication tool to quickly pass information to all homeowners. This site is endorsed and recommended by the VBPD, since it allows for the quick dissemination of information to all the adjacent neighborhoods. In addition, multiple city agencies post updates on Nextdoor. For example, the City of Virginia Beach provides updates on trash collections and city closings during inclement weather, town hall meetings, etc.

As Spring has arrived, please keep in mind that using "Greener" methods when updating your landscape is good for the environment and wildlife, especially those residents on the waterfront.

A "Green" tip from the Garden Club for weed and other invasive plant removal:

Combine ¼ cup Dawn, 2 cups Epson Salts, and 1 gallon of White vinegar. Carefully apply to weeds, etc... The Dawn allows the solution to stick to the plant while the salt and vinegar when touched by the Sun will do its magic. It will kill anything the solution touches so be careful. The good news is it works without adding toxic chemicals to your lawn!

The Garden Club continues with the landscape projects at all entrances to the neighborhood as well as litter control and maintenance to the Mews Pond area.

Just a friendly reminder... We ask that all Church Point Residents living along the drainage area that separates our neighborhood and Thoroughgood refrain from dumping yard waste and landscape waste in those areas. It would also be helpful after our City trash pickup day if residents would pick up stray waste that is left behind from the City's trucks. Any help is greatly appreciated.

As the end of our year approaches I'd like to thank our members for their assistance and participation in our Club programs and other projects in the City of Va. Beach. I look forward to another great year in 2016-2017.

Due to poor Winter weather conditions this year the March Landscape of the Month judging was omitted.













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
AREC Corner - Spring 2016

As the warmer temperatures of spring arrive, so does the opportunity for homeowners to get out and begin the annual Spring cleanup and plantings that always enhance our neighborhood curb appeal. Please remember that the Rules and Regulations require homeowners to keep their yards and landscape beds free and clear of weeds. Many do-it-yourselfers do fantastic jobs maintaining their yards and others utilize professional yard maintenance companies. There are some yards that still need attention, especially with turf maintenance to eliminate weeds and landscape/mulch beds. Herbicides are options but there are also numerous "green" options available at garden centers that don't impact the Chesapeake Bay. Additionally, it is again time for many homeowners to clean their fences, driveways and homes of discoloring growth. As a reminder for those who live along First Court Road, after pressure washing your fence, should you desire to apply a sealant product, please ensure it is a clear protecting sealant only on those fences to maintain a uniform appearance along the roadway as required in the rules.

As mentioned in previous articles, if you are planning on changing anything related to the exterior architectural design of the home (additions, decks, pools, etc) which also includes colors and finishes, please ensure you submit an Architectural Change Request Form (available for printing on our website www.churchpointonline.com or from The Select Group) prior to starting the project and with ample time for review by AREC and approval by the Board of Directors that only meet once a month. The basic premise is that if you are making a CHANGE to the exterior of your home, then an application is required to be submitted. If you are making repairs to your home (replacing rotted deck or fence boards, pressure washing, new roof of same color / type of shingle) or anything that is restoring your home it to its original appearance, color, shape, size, etc. then an application is not required, but when in doubt, please don't hesitate to send a quick email for clarification.

Finally, please remember that Sunday quiet hours are from 6PM on Saturday evening until Monday morning. As a reminder, leaves and yard clippings must be bagged in clear yard waste bags for pickup by the city and in accordance with HOA rules, cannot be placed on the curb in front of your home any earlier than Tuesday (the day before Church Point trash pickup).Curb appeal affects all homeowners both positive and negative so please do your part to help us maintain the curb appeal of our community.
