<u>President's Corner - Summer 2015</u>

Neighbors,

Summer has arrived and I hope everyone had a joyful and safe 4th of July holiday. Although things have been relatively quiet in the neighborhood the last several months, I did want to let the homeowners know that the numerous complaints this year about the condition of our landscaping are being actively addressed by the Board. The spring saw a lot of positive changes from Basnight Lawn Service with respect to work crew manning, staffing, quantity and especially supervision. A new maintenance crew and new supervisor (with previous experience in Church Point) is now in place. These changes did unfortunately come late this spring and multiple areas of the neighborhood and homeowners endured unacceptable levels of maintenance, to include 12" plus tall grass behind homes, improper/inadequate pruning and other deficiencies. The Board takes these issues seriously, as the performance of the landscape company directly impacts the curb appeal of our neighborhood. We are in the final year of the current landscape contract, and to date, Basnight has been implementing corrective actions to avoid termination, but the Board will be going to bid this fall for a new landscape contract. We realize many homeowners use Basnight services personally for their homes along with Bishop's Court, and as such, should Basnight continue to turn things around and perform within expectations of the current contract, they will be afforded the opportunity to bid on the new one.

Home sales have risen this year, which is great news as home values have also increased, but we are also seeing a surge in the number of landscape and trash bag violations being issued by the Community Manager. Failure to maintain your yards, to include regular grass cutting, weed control in lawns and beds and shrubbery pruning, is a rules violation, as is putting out yard bags to the curb prior to Tuesday afternoon. More importantly, failure to maintain your property directly impacts curb appeal, which is critical to making potential new homeowners feel like this is the community they want to live in and raise a family. It takes everyone's participation and cooperation to keep our community looking great. Please stay on top of yard maintenance every week, especially if leaving town for extended vacations, by having neighbors or landscape companies take care of your yards while you are away.







AREC Corner - Summer 2015

Summer has arrived, and with it comes the weekly task of yard maintenance. As everyone is aware, Church Point has strict rules related to maintaining your yards to ensure a uniform and consistent appearance throughout the neighborhood. Lawns should be green during growing season, and significantly weed free with the grass no taller than 6 inches. Landscape beds shall be weed free and shrubs need to be regularly pruned and maintained. The overgrown (unkempt) natural look is not acceptable in Church Point. Although the weather doesn't always cooperate to get all the required work with mowers/power tools/edgers and trimmers completed on Saturday, everyone needs to plan accordingly – quiet hours commence at 6PM on Saturday. Just because it rained Saturday does not waive the rule about using the previously noted equipment after 6PM that evening or anytime on Sunday. Manual yard work such as spreading mulch, picking weeds, and planting flowers/gardens can be performed on Sundays - just not with the use of power equipment (both gas and electric mowers, edgers/blowers/trimmers/chain saws, etc...).

When The Select Group, the Board of Directors or AREC get complaint calls from neighbors, violation letters are issued. Repeat offenders can be fined or called before the Board. Additionally, we are continuing to see yard waste (lawn bags/branches/etc.) placed out on the curbs over the weekend and before Tuesday. As a reminder, yard debris must be in clear trash bags, and branches no greater than three feet should grouped in small piles along the curb. For excessive pruning and large amounts of yard debris, a waste container can be requested from the city to be placed for 24 hours at your home for a small fee. We routinely hear of multiple homeowners getting together and chipping in to cover the cost of the waste contain err from the city and having a pruning party. Curb appeal affects all homeowners, both positively and negatively, so please do your part to help us maintain the curb appeal of our community. Neighborhood Watch – Summer 2015

We hope everyone had a happy and safe 4th of July holiday and a great beginning of summer. So far, this summer has seen very little reported crime activity in Church Point. We hope things continue to be safe and everyone remains vigilant in keeping your vehicles locked at night. Also, please ensure if you do go away on vacation and leave your home vacant that you follow basic safety precautions: security lights on timers to give the appearance that you are home, and putting a hold on your newspaper and postal service. Ask your neighbors to keep an eye out for delivered packages that may sit for days on your porch indicating. As a reminder, the City of Virginia Beach has a nightly curfew from 11 p.m. – 5 a.m. for anyone under the age of 18. We have received reports in the past of teenagers out roaming the streets, and hanging out at both the gazebo and the bridge leading to the shopping center well after midnight.

Thank you to everyone who has joined Nextdoor. If you have not joined yet, please consider signing up. Nextdoor (www.nextdoor.com) is a community specific site for the exchange of information, ideas, and community events, but most importantly a communication tool to get information out to all homeowners quickly. This site is endorsed and recommended by the VBPD, since it allows for the quick dissemination of information to all the adjacent neighborhoods. In addition, multiple city agencies post updates on Nextdoor, for example: updates on trash collections and city closings during inclement weather, town hall meetings, etc... You can adjust the settings on Nextdoor (and the mobile app) to receive only postings specific just to "Church Point" as opposed to "Church Point + neighborhoods" to avoid being inundated with unnecessary posts.
