Fences need to be pressure washed, especially the fences that back up to First Court Road – reminder only clear sealer is allowed, no staining of those fences. Finally, many driveways and walkways/sidewalks need to be pressure washed. These are all easy maintenance items that increase curb appeal of the homes and the community as a whole. In a real estate market where Church Point homes are commanding higher than normal values, those sales and price points help everyone's home value. Please do your part to increase curb appeal for everyone.

In conjunction with the lifting of COVD restrictions, the Board of Directors will begin looking into options to return to in person HOA and Board meetings again. Mike even personally removed a tree that had fallen near the gazebo to save the Association money. I have been asked to remind everyone that with summer approaching and school classes ending, please be aware of children out playing in the streets. Please keep your speed down on our streets and keep an eye out for children as well as bikers, walkers, and pets.

Vehicle break-ins continue to be a high-volume crime within the 3rd precinct. Please do your part not to be a statistic and make sure you keep your vehicle locked at all times. Do not leave any items of value visible in your vehicle or your car key fob (which seems crazy to me but the 3rd Precinct indicates it has become one of the more common types of vehicle thefts).

AREC Corner – Spring 2021

Spring brings warmer temps and more rain which results in increased weekly yard maintenance. As everyone is aware, Church Point has strict rules related to maintaining your yard to ensure a uniform and consistent appearance throughout the neighborhood. Your lawn should be green during growing season, significantly weed free with the grass no taller than 6 inches. Your landscape beds shall be weed free and your shrubs need to be regularly pruned and maintained. The overgrown/ unkept/natural look is not acceptable in Church Point and is a rules violation. Excessive neglect is also a violation of city ordinance.

Although the weather doesn't always cooperate to get all the required work with mowers/power tools/edgers and trimmers completed on Saturday by 6pm – everyone needs to plan accordingly – quiet hours commence at 6PM on Saturday through Sunday. Just because it rained Saturday does not waive the rule about using the previously noted equipment which are prohibited after 6PM Saturday or anytime on Sunday. Manual yard work can be performed on Sundays like spreading mulch, picking weeds, planting flowers/gardens - just not with the use of power equipment (mowers, edger, blowers, trimmers, chain saws, etc., etc., both gas and electric, also including power washers) that will disturb your neighbors. This applies to contract landscape companies also – if they work for you and they do work on a Sunday, you are responsible and in violation.

The Select Group, the Board of Directors and AREC get complaint calls from neighbors and violation letters are issued by Select Group. Repeat offenders can be fined or called for a hearing before the Board. Additionally, we are continuing to see yard waste (lawn bags/branches/etc) placed out on the curbs over the weekend and before Tuesday. Reminder that yard debris must be in clear trash bags and branches/etc need to be in small piles no greater than 3 feet long. If you have excessive pruning/yard debris, a waste container can be requested from the city for a small fee to be placed for 24 hrs at your home. We routinely hear of multiple homeowners getting together and chipping in to cover the cost of the waste container from the city and having a pruning party.

Curb appeal affects all homeowners both positive and negative, so please do your part to help us maintain the curb appeal of our community. If you have questions about whether an application is required or not, please do not hesitate to contact us at <u>arec.churchpointhoa@gmail.com</u>.
