## President's Corner - Winter 2019

Neighbors,

Happy New Year! I hope everyone had a safe and joyful holiday season. On November 20th, we held the annual meeting at the Bayside Recreation Center. The meeting was well attended and thank you to all the homeowner's that did attend to help us achieve a quorum. The annual Board of Directors election had three candidates on the ballot with two incumbents running for re-election, myself and Matt Ripley, along with a new candidate from Bishops Court and a write-in candidate. Both incumbent candidates were re-elected to the Board and I know I speak for Matt when I say we are both honored to have been re-elected for another 2-year term to represent you, the homeowners, on the Board.

Annually the costs to maintain our aging trees in the common land continue to climb – especially along the carriage path (common path that borders the golf course). These costs can reach a couple thousand dollars per tree for the removal of an aged, tall dead tree. A terrific suggestion was made by our Landscape Committee Chairman, Ron Dennis, at the annual meeting to proactively eliminate the ivy growth on the trees that is detrimental to the longevity and health of the trees. Ron has taken his time to identify over 50 trees along the carriage path at risk from ivy by marking them with yellow spray paint. Myself, along with my wife and fellow Board member Jack Palmer, have worked several of the recent weekends in January tackling the ivy removal by cutting and removing ivy vines around the trunks of trees. The ivy vines can range from 1" to over 4" inches thick having been growing for decades or more. It is slow going and labor intensive thus, in an effort to continue to be good stewards of the HOA finances, we are seeking volunteers willing to donate an hour or so of their time on Saturdays during the month of February to help continue to clear the remaining 30 plus trees. Additionally, we recently had a couple of car accidents on First Court Road that damaged HOA property to include a couple sections of wooden railing down in the Mews along with a sign post and one of the brick columns along the main entry drive lane. The Board has pursued the insurance carriers for both accidents and all repairs will be covered with no expenditure of HOA funds.

Finally, December saw the neighborhood get into the Holiday spirit with many homeowners going all out decorating their homes with holiday lights. Thank you to the Social Committee for coordinating the annual lights contest which I'm sure was difficult to judge this year with all the great looking homes. A special Thank You to the Garden Club for going above and beyond to decorate the community entrances and Gazebo for the holidays, along with the lights on the Crepe Myrtles as coordinated by the Board. ### **AREC Corner - Winter 2019**

Winter is a great time to begin the planning for your spring projects and getting quotes from contractors who may give special deals in the off season. For those looking at large projects like installing pools, additions or large deck areas please ensure you include a site plan with your application to aid AREC in the review process. Please submit applications before you sign contracts and schedule the work with your contractor to allow adequate time for review by AREC and approval by the Board. As always, please ensure you do your research on contractors (references, better business bureau, complaints on file) and most importantly ensure they are licensed contractors with the state and have proper insurances (general liability and especially workman's comp) to protect yourself, should things not go right. Strangely there has been a large increase in owners requesting to install sheds in their yards – the rules are specific that no detached structures be built and that attached structures must resemble the primary home (same roof, same siding, same color, etc.)

In the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2018, we saw a large increase in violation letters being sent out for lawn and leaf bags/tree limbs/etc. being put out at the curb early – in some cases even the Friday before trash day. Although we know most of the bags were put out by private landscapers contracted by the specific homeowner – it is the homeowner's responsibility to ensure the contractors are fully aware and compliant with our rules. The rules are specific to restrict putting trash / lawn bags and cans out at the street until Tuesday afternoon which is the day before trash day - please don't put bags and cans out on the weekend, Monday or even on Tuesday morning. The intent of the rule was to avoid the very issues we are encountering with bags at the curb over the weekend. The weekends are the primary time of the week when future potential neighbors are looking at homes to buy in our community and we need the community looking its best. Curb appeal increases the value of all our homes. Additionally, prompt removal from the street of all cans is required by end of day on Wednesday and please store your cans out of site from the street to maintain curb appeal and rules compliance. 
# Neighborhood Watch – Winter 2019 By Kim Burke and Betsy Guglielmo

Happy New Year! We attended the Citizen's Advisory Committee meeting on 1/17 for the Virginia Beach PD 3rd Precinct. We have a new Captain for the Third Precinct, Captain Reo Hatfield. Captain Hatfield informed us there continues to be an increase in motor vehicle break-ins along the Shore Drive corridor. The individuals are going around flipping door handles and very rarely busting windows out unless they see items of value. The vast majority of the thefts are from unlocked vehicles. Please keep your vehicle doors locked and set car alarms if you have them. The new buzz words in the 3<sup>rd</sup> precinct are: "Beep It To Keep It". Overall, crime continues to be down in the precinct and especially in Church Point.

Even though the holidays are over, on-line ordering is becoming routine and subsequently porch thefts continue year-round. Below are a few tips we would like to share with you from the Virginia Beach Police Department's Community Engagement Unit (CEU) reminding everyone to stay vigilant year-round.


- 1. Sign up for delivery alerts so you know when your delivery is scheduled and when the package has arrived.
- 2. If you are not able to be home when a package will be delivered, ask a trusted neighbor to hold it for you.
- 3. If, possible, require a signature for all deliveries.
- 4. Consider shipping packages to your place of work or use the ship to store option.
- 5. Be a good neighbor! If you see a package on your neighbor's doorstep, reach out and ask if they would like you to hold it until they are home.
- 6. Keep an eye out in the neighborhood. If you see someone attempting to take packages get a description and a license plate, if possible. Use your phone to take a picture. DO NOT approach a criminal, and call 911 immediately.

Additionally, if you are not aware, the USPS also offers photo delivery, so you can see what mail is being delivered each day to your mailbox. You need to sign up through the App for your phone; it is available in the App Store and is called "Informed Delivery." As always, if you see suspicious activity in the neighborhood, please call the VBPD non-emergency # 385-5000. 
