The survey was prepared and conducted by Mr. Kristos Kaltsonoudis as part of a graduate study program at ODU. The survey was distributed via email through the Neighborhood Watch network.

That goes for the HOA Board as well. This fall, several Board members will be at the end of their terms, and we would welcome more homeowners to come forward and volunteer to run for Board positions. Serving on the Board or in these other leadership positions gives you a new perspective on Church Point and a chance to help maintain our excellent standing in Virginia Beach.

Neighborhood Watch by LaTanya Cole

Over the past 6 years, a team of Block Captains and I have volunteered our time and energy in keeping the neighborhood safe. Some of these leaders have moved to other neighborhoods, some still live here but have moved on to other projects/responsibilities and others have just moved on. Some blocks have a second person in command that helps the block captain whenever needed or when they go on vacation but some blocks are captain-less. I fill in the gaps where I can but it is getting harder and harder. It is time to request a new group of volunteers to step up and join the effort. I need some of you to volunteer to be a Captain or a back-up Captain.

In May, I will be leaving notes at the houses within the blocks that need a Captain and/or a back up Captain. The position of Block Captain does not require much time -- we need a responsible person who has a computer, access to email and concern for their neighborhood. Sometimes, a Captain may take a call from an upset neighbor whose car has been broken into or a call from someone that thinks they saw a crime occur but are not quite certain. Ask any block captain how much time they devote to Neighborhood Watch; time spent is usually sending 'crime report' emails to the people within their respective blocks. After the initial training, the time commitment for a Block Captain is about 15 minutes a week. Can you spare that much time?

I would like to try opening up some new positions in our Neighborhood Watch program. I need a team of teenagers that will help as needed for Neighborhood Watch. Our "TeenWatch" (name could possibly change) program will help our youth learn about the real world in a safe environment while they give back to the community. Projects will vary but mostly they will design and/or pass out flyers and their supervisor will either be myself or another Block Captain. Volunteer credit hours can be earned and for those in the 9th through 12th grades – these hours look great when applying to college! Applications will be available in May through the Block Captains listed below.

The Church Point Garden Club's 2009 "Landscape of the Month" recognition began in April. For those new to Church Point, the Garden Club alternates the monthly award between three neighborhood areas, The Quays & Commons East, The Commons & Bishops Court and The Mews. Various Garden Club members volunteer to travel the neighborhood and bestow the award on the deserving landscape. Landscapes maintained by the professional or the amateur are recognized. Once selected, the home will not be eligible to receive the award again for two years. Judges evaluate seasonal interest and color, lawn and plant maintenance, along with overall harmony and balance. Perfection is not the goal, but neatness does count. With so many enjoyable landscapes to choose from, it is an honor to receive this very special award of recognition.

The Commons East & Bishops Court was the focus for the award in April, and the Landscape of the Month was awarded to **Mr. and Mrs. Rod Duckworth** at **1701 Benns Church Place** in Bishops Court. The Mews will be the focus of the May award; The Quays & Commons East in June and back to The Commons East & Bishops Court in July. The August award is a *President's Choice* and the entire Church Point neighborhood is eligible.

Scoop The Poop!

Please remember to clean up after your dogs! The Winter 2006 *Church Point Post* made a similar plea, and it's time for a reminder. Hey, we all love dogs. But one of the facts of life of modern subdivision living is that dogs need their exercise and they need to poop somewhere in the development! Whether it's on the owner's lawn, the common area, or a neighbor's yard, it's important for the poop to be properly disposed of. The Virginia Beach SPCA has launched an initiative to convince dog owners that cleaning up pet waste is important to the environment. They've devoted a web page to the effort (vbspca.com/poop). Below is their description of how Poop Pollutes:

"Dog waste pollutes:

The water...

Pet waste degrades water quality leading to cloudy, green water from accelerated algae and weed growth, objectionable odors, and dead fish and other organisms. Up to one fourth of the fecal coliform in the polluted Lynnhaven River is from pet waste. Pet waste left in yards as far away as Green Run eventually reaches the city's historic waterway.

The air..

In addition to odors, flies and other pest insects can also increase when pet waste is disposed of improperly, becoming a nuisance and adding another vector for disease transmission.

Communities... Finally, pet waste pollutes friendships. "

Tree Trimming at Main Entrance Should Enhance Safety

Those of you driving in Church Point's main entrance every day should be seeing things a little more clearly now. The large cryptomeria tree on the right side of the entrance had gotten so big that it partially blocked the view of traffic coming from the right on Church Point Place. The Board recently instructed our landscaper to trim up the bottom 4-5 feet of the tree to allow a more unobstructed view in that direction. As you can see from the photos on the right, it makes a significant difference in visibility.

While that change should make the intersection safer, drivers still need to be careful there. Too many vehicles are coasting through the stop sign and driving too fast along that area. As summer approaches, there will be more traffic, especially walkers, joggers, and kids on bikes or skates around the gazebo area. Please drive carefully in that area and throughout Church Point so everyone has a safe and enjoyable summer!

Time to Fight Those Pesky Weeds!

Not everyone wants or can afford a lawn care service to keep the lawn green and weed free. We don't want to poison the Lynnhaven River with pesticides, weed killers, and fertilizers, but careful and judicious use of the right kind of chemicals or natural materials can help save the environment and also keep Church Point as beautiful as ever.

We all owe it to our neighbors to make sure weeds in our yard aren't thriving and spreading next door to negate their hard work.

Zoning Hearing Planned for Manor House Restaurant

The Manor House has informed us that they have asked the city for a zoning variance for the occupancy level of the Cellars restaurant. You may have seen the signs posted by the Manor House announcing the hearing, which was originally scheduled for April 8, but has been postponed until a later date.

The director of the Manor House told the HOA Board members that while the Cellars restaurant, bar, and lounge area was designed for a maximum occupancy of about 50 people, the owners just recently learned that the zoning established back in 1994 -- when the Church Point developer first obtained permission for a B&B and restaurant – allows maximum occupancy of only 25. No one caught this discrepancy all through the sale process of the Manor House in 2007. The Manor House is asking the city to allow it to operate at the same level it has operated for the past year. According to the director, it is not proposing any increase in size. The HOA Board will monitor this issue
