We hope everyone is enjoying their summer. Betsy and I are excited about taking over as your new Neighborhood Watch Coordinators. We can't thank La Tanya enough for the tremendous support during this turnover and again for her years of service to our neighborhood. We also would like to thank everyone who attended the CPNW Crime Prevention Meeting in April hosted by the VBPD 3rd Precinct. It was nice to see such a great turnout of neighbors representative from all the sections of Church Point. If you were unable to attend the meeting, we have included some helpful information below provided by The Virginia Beach Police Department.

- 1. Most burglars gain access by breaking through a back door of the house. There is an Antitheft Window film on the market that can be adhered to the outside or inside of a window (search online for 'anti theft window film'). It makes is very hard for anyone to break a window. These are also available for car windows.
- 2. Half of all burglaries occur during the day.
- 3. Most people whose homes have residential home alarms, don't use them during the day when they are out. You might want to contact your alarm company and have them add your cell phone number as a backup. If your telephone line is cut, they can notify you immediately.
- 4. Since January 2010, there have been 13 car burglaries in Church Point. Only two of them had broken glass, all the others were left unlocked. Do not leave any important items in your vehicle or valuables (GPS, Ipod, cell phone, laptop, golf clubs, etc) in sight and make sure it is locked at all times.
- Garage door openers are another way burglars are accessing homes. There have been instances where unlocked cars in driveways gave burglars access to the garage door openers which allowed access to the garage/house. Make sure the inner door to the house is locked.

It is very important that you turn on your outside lights at night or install a motion sensing light. Also, keep bushes near windows trimmed to eliminate hiding places. If you are going out-of-town, have a neighbor keep an eye out and install inexpensive timers for interior lights. Remember that with the warm weather, there tends to be more activity. If you see suspicious activity, call the VBPD non emergency # 385-5000.

In closing, we look forward to working together with everyone to ensure we make Church Point an even safer place to live. We were very pleased to hear your Board of Directors approved a summer security patrol to help keep our neighborhood safe during the weekend evenings. Some "Good Neighbor" Tips for Summer

Summer is in full swing, and that means more time outside in the backyard, by the pool, or on the deck or patio. Warm evenings mean that it's also inviting to stay outside late talking with friends or listening to music. Please bear in mind during this season that we need to be considerate of our neighbors. Here are some ways you can help:

- There are some great outdoor sound systems in the neighborhood, but please try to keep the volume at a level that serves your needs but doesn't blanket the whole block in music!Be aware that voices and other noises carry very far on a quiet night. What may seem like a quiet conversation can sound like a raucous cacophony to your neighbors several houses away.
- Be especially aware that Church Point observes quiet hours from 6 pm Saturdays until 8 am Mondays. That means no power tools -- lawn mowers, blowers, saws, etc. -- should be used outside, and other noise should be kept to a minimum, during those hours.
- Barking dogs can be a quiet hours problem, too. They are not aware of our rules but you as the owner should be! Please make a special effort to keep your pets quiet during the quiet hours. A neighbor's barking dog can put a damper on a backyard get-together on Saturday or Sunday night. Speaking of dogs, please don't forget to "Scoop the Poop" when you take your dog out for a walk!

Church Point Social Committee News


