I was additionally humbled in November to be elected by the current Board of Directors to serve as your HOA Board of Director's President for the next term. It was encouraging to see so many homeowners as candidates for Board positions at the last election. The turnout was the most in quite a long time and inspiring that so many homeowners want to get involved to help their neighborhood.

The Board is in the process of making some changes to help streamline processes and procedures. The Board has been hard at work in the first three months in office starting us down that path. All homeowners will be receiving in the mail a couple of resolution changes focusing on fence standards and dues payment date clarification. Additionally, changes were made to the former Architectural Controls Committee and Rules Enforcement Committee along with a revised and updated Architectural Change Application that will be posted to the website. I want to thank three homeowners who volunteered to form the new committee mentioned above: Chris Caporicci, Ron Creamer, and Jack Palmer. The Board looks forward to their support.

The new Board has gone to work on several important issues; namely the main entrance lighting, the landscaping condition and missing signage in the Mews Section of our neighborhood. The Board approved a lighting retrofit for the main entrance as well as wiring repairs which are addressed in a separate article in this issue of the newsletter. The Board also approved procuring replacement "Private Lane" signs for the several that had gone missing. Finally, the Board undertook revising our requirements for landscaping maintenance and a new RFP (Request for Proposal) has gone out to contractors for bid to be effective on April 1st.

In conclusion, I hope everyone had a joyful holiday season, a Happy New Year and joins me in hoping the warmer weather gets here soon.

Highlights from HOA Annual Meeting By Neal Curtin

The Church Point HOA annual homeowners' meeting was held in October at the Bayside Recreation Center. Besides the election of Board members for the new year, several interesting issues were raised and discussed. Here are a few highlights:

Outgoing President Steve Carnes presented the 2011 budget, and -- to everyone's relief – reported that there would be no need to raise quarterly dues this year. He pointed out, however, that perhaps because of the struggling economy there has been an increase in delinquencies for paying dues. Delinquencies have climbed to about \$8,000 now. While the money will eventually be collected, the late payments put a squeeze on the HOA's cash flow.

Several issues were raised by homeowners during an open forum discussion:

Social activities in Church Point – Some homeowners would like to see the HOA sponsor more social events as a chance to build community spirit and allow residents to meet. A picnic, perhaps in the Spring, could be held in one of the Church Point parks or at the Manor House. The Board would love to see this happen, but they need a volunteer to step forward to get it organized.

Rules violations – One homeowner pointed out that there are a rash of violations of Church Points rules and covenants, and he urged all residents to take a role in helping enforce these rules. Especially problematic are illegal signs in yards and trash and yard debris put on the street before collection day. Complying with the rules makes Church Point a better place to live.

Select Group – One resident expressed dissatisfaction with our HOA Manager Select Group and asked if we had considered looking for another company to act as manager.

First Court Road appearance – Some residents expressed concern about the appearance of Church Point from First Court Road. They have noticed weeds, litter, lack of mulch in some areas, and deteriorating fences – all of which add up to a bad impression for passing motorists. Some of these things can be taken care of through more emphasis by our landscaper; others require money. Mulching the entire area along the fence, for example, could cost several thousand dollars.

Note from a nearby Civic League: Keep an eye out for an older dark blue GMC van with a ladder rack and ladder on top. The van has no side windows. It will either have Virginia license plate XKD-1752 or Florida license plate 825-HTD. In either case there will likely be a license plate on the back only. We believe the occupants of this van are possibly involved with residential burglaries, particularly targeting garages and sheds - looking for power tools that can be easily sold. Main Entrance Lighting Retrofit Project

The HOA Board has approved the expenditure of capital improvement funds to retrofit the main entrance lighting for increased illumination and energy savings. First and foremost, we had an electrician rewire the circuitry to relocate the controlling photo cells out of the shade and clean up some temporary wiring that has been getting us through. The center and right sides have been restored to service and we are actively pursuing repairs to get the left side operational where the primary power feed underground is damaged.

The Board also undertook steps to reduce energy costs being incurred by the Association by converting the existing low voltage 35 watt halogen bulbs to 4.5 watt long life LED bulbs – fully guaranteed for 5 years. Additionally, the 8 light poles that were previously each illuminated with a 165 watt High Pressure Sodium bulb were reconfigured to accept an energy efficient 65 watt bulb. Finally, the Board undertook the installation of several new fixtures to enhance the appearance and curb appeal of the entrance, specifically accenting the crape myrtles along the center island and several brick columns.

Even with the additional new fixtures, the energy savings from the rest of the retrofits (800 watts saved from the light poles and 1,342 watts saved from ground lights) will create a complete project cost ROI (Return on Investment) of approx 24 months. This payback of expenditures will provide additional necessary funding for additional HOA projects.
