The Landscaping Committee has walked the entire common areas with an arborist and marked around 20 trees that need removal and many that require trimming or cleanup of different sorts. Architectural Review and Enforcement Committee

Article content reused from previous newsletters

Spring brings warmer temperatures and more rain which results in increased weekly yard maintenance. As everyone is aware, Church Point has strict rules related to maintaining your yard to ensure a uniform and consistent appearance throughout the neighborhood. Your lawn should be green during growing season, significantly weed free with the grass no taller than 6 inches. Your landscape beds shall be weed free and your shrubs need to be regularly pruned and maintained. The overgrown/unkept natural look is not acceptable in Church Point and is a rules violation. Excessive neglect is also a violation of city ordinance.

Although the weather doesn't always cooperate to get all the required work with mowers/power tools/edgers and trimmers completed on Saturday by 6pm – everyone needs to plan accordingly – quiet hours are from 6 PM on Saturday until 8 AM on Monday. Just because it rained Saturday does not waive the rule. Manual yard work can be performed on Sundays like spreading mulch, picking weeds, planting flowers/gardens. This also applies to contracted landscaping companies – if they work for you, you are responsible and you might be in violation.

The Board of Directors get complaints from neighbors all the time and violation letters are issued. Repeat offenders can be fined or called for a hearing before the Board. Additionally, we are continuing to see yard waste (lawn bags/branches/etc) placed out on the curbs over the weekend and before Tuesday. Remember that yard debris must be in clear trash bags and branches/etc need to be in small piles no greater than 3 feet long. If you have excessive pruning/yard debris, a waste container can be requested from the city for a small fee to be



placed for 24 hrs at your home. We routinely hear of multiple homeowners getting together and chipping in to cover the cost of the waste container from the city and having a pruning party.

Please also remind your landscaping contractors that any yard debris resulting from their work cannot be placed curbside. It is a city ordinance that they must dispose of it themselves. Curb appeal affects all homeowners both positive and negative, so please do your part to help us maintain the curb appeal of our community.

The newly created Church Point HOA Communications Committee has been hard at work adding information to our website at <u>https://churchpointonline.com/</u>. Today the website has over 200 pages with information about the neighborhood and the HOA. You can find all the governing documents, descriptions of our 33 acres of common land, the history of this area in Virginia Beach, newsletters dating back to 2005, event announcements and photos, agendas and minutes of board meetings as of last year and much more on the site. The home page provides the most relevant links and the menubar, which is accessible from every page, will take you to major information categories. If you really can't find what your are looking for, every page also has a Google style search box.



A new <u>set of forms</u> to report issues to the board or landscaping issues in our common areas to the landscaping committee are also available on the website. When you fill out the form, an email will be sent to the responsible people. Soon, we will also have a form to make recommendations for contractors and suppliers. This will allow us to create page with references as well as ratings and testimonials provided by home/lot owners.

The Communications Committee is continuing to upload current and historical information to the website to ensure that home/lot owners have a single place to find everything they are looking for. Suggestions are welcome and can be sent to <u>communications@churchpointonline.com</u>.

A new opt-in, opt-out notification system that allows Church Point home/lot owners to subscribe to specific information categories was also set up. At any given time, people can change their preferences or even unsubscribe completely. More details and a signup form are available on the website at https://churchpointonline.com/opt-in-opt-out-communications/. You can also reach this page from the front page or using the forms menu on any page.

Dreaming of a Church Point Butterfly and Pollination Garden

How did the Monarch Butterfly get its name? European settlers to North America were enamored by Prince William of Orange (Crowned King William III). When they saw the butterfly, they named it "Monarch" due to its orange color and in the Prince's honor.

Why are pollinators crucial to our lives? Humanity and the ecosystem would die. Nearly 80% of global plants require pollination to produce all our food.

Centuries of human expansion and industry have encroached on the natural habitats of wildlife. This combined with pollution and insecticides have been decreasing the population of these delicate animals on which our survival depends.

To help educate our children and assist mother nature, The Board of Directors has sanctioned the creation of a butterfly and pollination garden on the common area across from the Manor House. Planting and maintaining this garden will be a hands-on learning experience. You will learn what plants attract certain pollinators and how to raise Monarch Butterflies, their migration pattern and life cycle. This opportunity is available from ages 8 to adult.

During the January 22nd, 2024 meeting, The Church Point Homeowners Association Board of Directors, in accordant with the <u>Bylaws (Article III, Section 4h)</u>, (re)established five committees through resolutions to assist them in running the association. Most of this work was done through a <u>Committee Reform</u> initiative. Now that the committees have formally been (re)established, volunteers are required to run these committees and perform the associated duties.

Who wants to help out?

We all know that Church Point Homeowners are very busy people that are probably not looking for more work. Luckily, the various committees have different needs and some volunteers only need to keep an open eye, help with a single event or contribute a few paragraphs to the website or newsletter. Other volunteer jobs might require a few hours per week. Any help is greatly appreciated.



Why would you help?

Church Point is a highly desirable neighborhood that strives to have above-average property values, a robust family-oriented social fabric and well-maintained <u>common areas</u> (over 33 acres). Our collective Property Tax assessment is well over 300 million dollars and while nobody looks forward to the associated tax bill, everybody wants the highest property value when they sell their house. The HOA plays a key role in protecting our investments through continuous improvement, volunteerism and effective communications. When you volunteer, you help the HOA to help you.

Examples of what we need (read the linked committee pages for the whole list of duties) The <u>Architectural and Rules Enforcement Committee</u> has been around the longest but it also has been hard to find volunteers for it. Many people see this as the HOA Police Force to say NO to homeowners who want to make architectural changes to their property. While it is true that we have rules that must be followed, successful committee members have worked with homeowners in the past to find practical solutions that meet the requirements but still give the homeowner what they are looking for. If you are flexible, creative and can bring people together, this committee is looking for you.

The <u>Budget Committee</u> is a new entity. Initially there will be a lot of work to stabilize the budget and establish repeatable processes. Anybody with a financial background or people that care about taking care of our assets or balance income and expenditures is welcome to assist.

The <u>Communications Committee</u> is also new and will help the Board in its desire to be more open and transparent, streamline communications between the board and the members and speak with one voice on all platforms. If you want to help with the website, newsletters or social media in terms of writing a few paragraphs, take pictures at events or ensure notifications go out on time, this committee might be for you.

The <u>Landscaping Committee</u> has been around for a long time but the new version of this committee also absorbs the functions previously performed by the now defunct Garden Club. If you want to help oversee our landscaping company keep the common areas up to our standards (we spend over half of our budget on this), select yards of the month or assist in beautifying common areas, you might be the right person.

The <u>Social Committee</u> has existed informally for a long time but it is now an official part of the HOA. If you want to help plan and run social events, welcome new neighbors to the neighborhood, assist with yard sales or simply write a few words about events or take pictures, join this committee.

Annual Church Point Yard Sale - May 18th, 2024

The Church Point social committee is organizing the Annual Yard Sale on Saturday May 18th, 2024 from 8.00 AM until 1:00 PM.

Tips for a Successful Yard Sale:

- 1. Start Early. Put things in a designated area for the upcoming sale.
- 2. Price Everything. Use masking tape or labels, and group items by price points for fast and easy pricing. (Ex. \$1.00 table) Or you could buy pre-printed tags (Ex. \$.25, \$.50) so you just peel and stick!
- **3.** Have a Change Fund. A total of \$10.00 in coins and small bills should be plenty.
- **4. Get the Children Involved**! Consider letting them get involved, by selling sodas or lemonade. They can also set up their own table of toys for a little entrepreneur endeavor!
- 5. Save Grocery Bags, for people who purchase multiple items.
- 6. **Display items**, on card tables, Ping-Pong tables, or patio tables.
- 7. At the End of the Sale, donate any of the remaining items to charity. A CHKD truck will pick them up if you leave them out.
